DAY 1

Morning

KELVINGROVE ART GALLERY & MUSEUM

Take curator-led tour of Kelvingrove Art Gallery Museum to see the largest permanent display of work in the world by the key names in the Glasgow Style movement including Charles Rennie Mackintosh and Margaret Macdonald. While largely local to the city of Glasgow, they and their work had a far-reaching impact at the time and today continue to enjoy worldwide interest and appeal. The Mackintosh and Glasgow Style Gallery's fantastic collection of objects and furniture includes stained glass and metalwork as well as reconstructed rooms from this internationally important period of design.

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THE MACKINTOSH HOUSE

See how Charles Rennie Mackintosh and his wife, artist Margaret Macdonald Mackintosh lived with a visit to their beautiful home. The Mackintosh House is a meticulous re-assembly of the principal interiors from the Mackintosh's Glasgow home from 1906-1914. Substantial alterations were made to the home in 1906 as Mackintosh remodelled the proportions and natural lighting of the Victorian house. The principal interiors were decorated in his distinctive style, remarkable then, and now with each room an outstanding work of art.

HOUSE FOR AN ART LOVER

Visit the unique visitor attraction located in the tranquil surrounds of Bellahouston Park. Take a stroll around the walled garden, enjoy a self-guided tour of the House or relax in the cafe and terrace.

Located in the town of Helensburgh, less than an hour from Glasgow, The Hill House was built as Mackintosh's vision of a home for the future between 1902 and 1904. Due to a 10-year conservation programme, the house is surrounded by a protective box offering visitors a new perspective of the property.
